Agudah Election-Day Breakfast With Political VIPs And Community Activists





These children will bring home the lessons they have learned, encouraging their parents to attend shul with them, to keep kosher and start keeping Shabbos.

The children of Be'er Hagolah are a living testament to, "the children bringing their parents back"...to Yiddishkeit.
