## Agudah Breakfast To **Highlight Security And** Safety, November 7

Hundreds of grassroots communal leaders from across the broad spectrum of Orthodox Jewry are expected to attend the Second Annual Legislative Breakfast of Agudath Israel of America on Monday, November 7 at the Down Town Association, located at 60 Pine Street.

The theme of this year's breakfast is "Safety and Security in Our Communities." The breakfast will showcase Agudath Israel's close working relationship with a diverse body of elected and governmental officials to serve the community and to help enhance safety and security in a variety of meaningful ways.

Delivering special remarks at the breakfast will be the newly appointed White House director of Jewish outreach, Jarrod Bernstein. While Mr. Bernstein has extensive experience in government—having served in New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg's community affairs division, and then in the federal Department of Homeland Security—his appearance at the Agudath Israel breakfast will mark Mr. Bernstein's maiden voyage into the Jewish community as a representative of President Obama.

"The fact that the President of the United States is sending his director of Jewish outreach to the Agudath Israel breakfast as his first public appearance underscores the high priority the Administration is placing on reaching out to our community," said Rabbi Gedaliah Weinberger, chairman of Agudath Israel's board of trustees.

Keynoting the breakfast will be Loretta E. Lynch, United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York. Ms. Lynch, who has served in this position since 1999, has played a major role in keeping our communities and indeed our country a safer place. Most recently, U.S. Attorney Lynch has collaborated with the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force to ensure that all legal steps are taken to prevent and thwart terrorist activity in the Eastern District. She has earned a national reputation as one of the country's most innovative and effective law enforcement officials in combating terror.

"We are greatly honored that US Attorney Lynch has agreed to keynote our breakfast and to address our constituents directly on a subject of such extreme importance," remarked Rabbi David Zwiebel, executive vice president of Agudath Israel. "Her leadership in securing the recent guilty plea of the terrorist who attempted to bomb the New York City subway system is an outstanding example of law enforcement at its best."

Agudath Israel of America sponsors a broad range of communal social services and children's welfare programs affecting the lives of young and old throughout the New York City Metropolitan area.
