Horowitz, to address the gap in health services facing the underserved immigrant and Jewish communities in Brooklyn. *Nachas strives to help children, families, and seniors attain physical and psychological wellness in a dignified manner*.

Currently, Nachas has flourished into a full-fledged healthcare facilitation including information, referral and screening services. An experienced social service department is staffed with multi-lingual culturally sensitive case managers that specialize in accessing entitlements. Nachas has become one of the leading facilitators in the region enrolling more than five thousand persons annually into government sponsored health insurances.

Nachas Health maintains a special department dedicated to supporting and advocating on behalf of seniors with a focus on *Holocaust Survivors*. The department is staffed with bilingual social workers, therapists, peer counselors, and case managers, all are experts in dealing with senior issues- specifically mental health, entitlements, and support counseling groups. Our weekly groups including aerobics and yoga keep the elderly active and focused.

The "Women's Health Screening Project" initiated in 1995 screens hundreds of uninsured women annually. Vital life-saving cancer screenings are offered monthly free of charge in non-clinical, non-threatening settings (restaurants etc.). By focusing on early detection and post screening follow-up, treatment and care all administered with the personal touch of the Nachas Health's coordinators, we have met with significant success in reaching economically disadvantaged and underserved women in the communities we service.

It is truly the goal and commitment of Nachas Health and Family Network, Inc. to enable every child, family, and senior access quality healthcare and social services through direct services, referral, entitlement navigation and advocacy.
